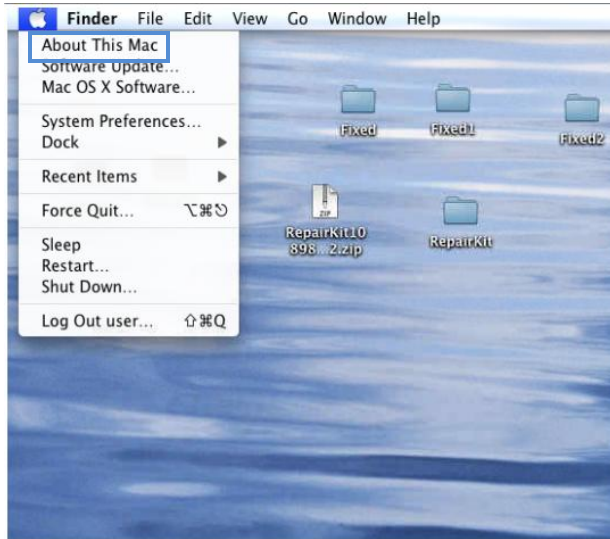


This article shows how to use the System Profiler to get information about a Mac computer, such as the installed hardware and software and what peripheral devices are connected, and how to save that information as a report.

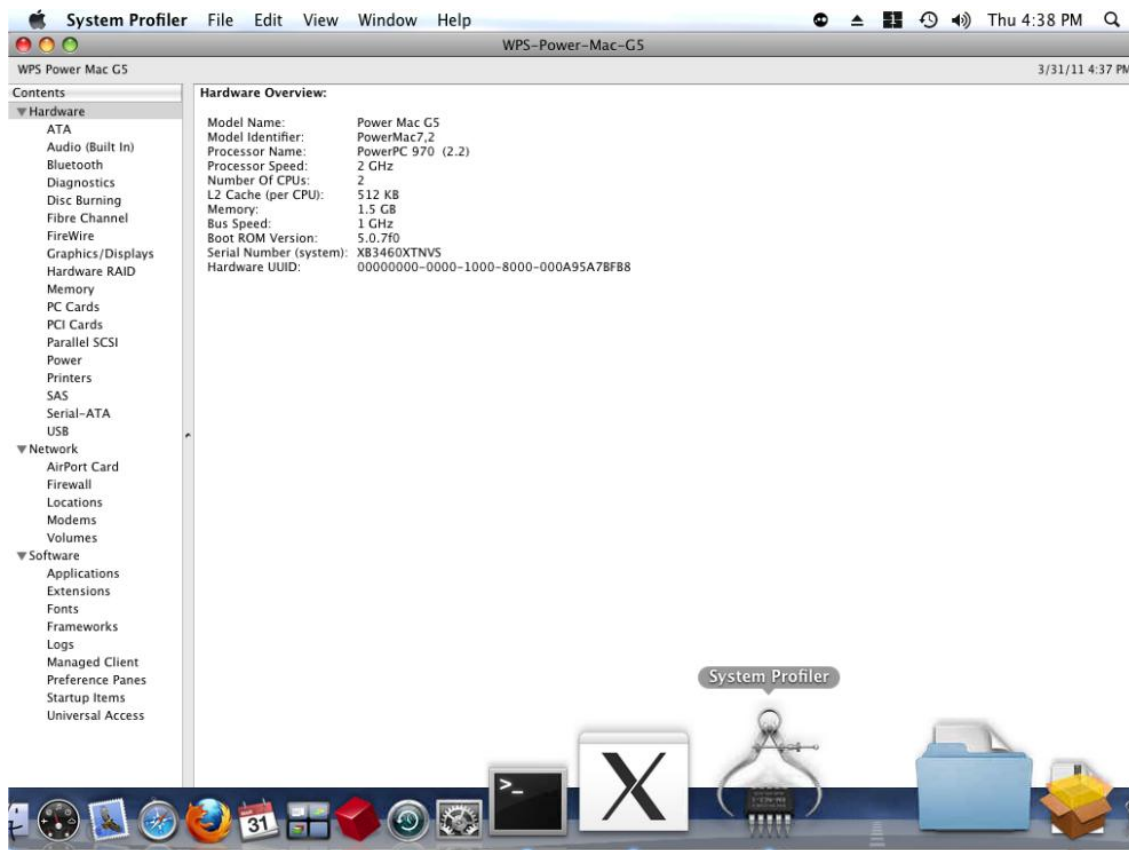
1. Choose **Apple menu > About This Mac**.



2. Click **More Info** to open the System Profiler.



3. Click the topics on the left to see the information you're looking for. To see more detail, click the triangle next to an item.



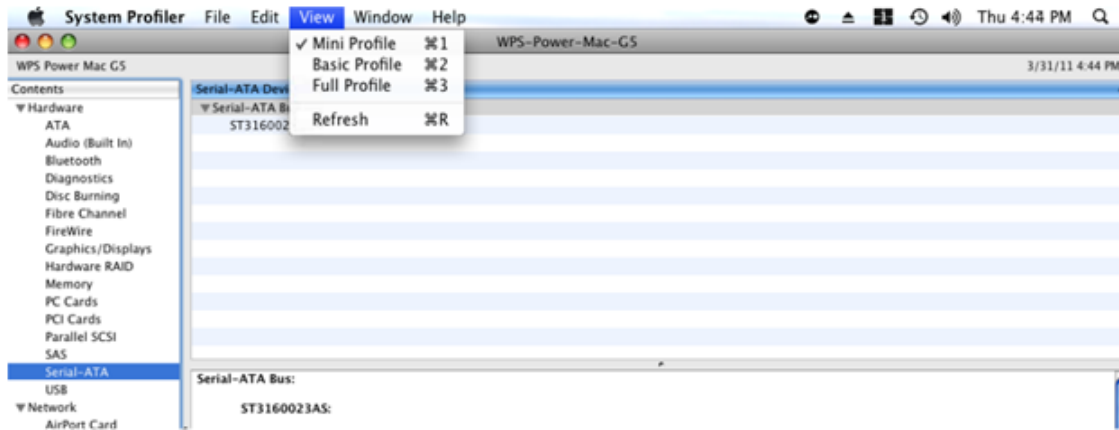
Saving a System Profiler Report

You can save a System Profiler report as plain text, Rich Text Format (RTF), or System Profiler format.

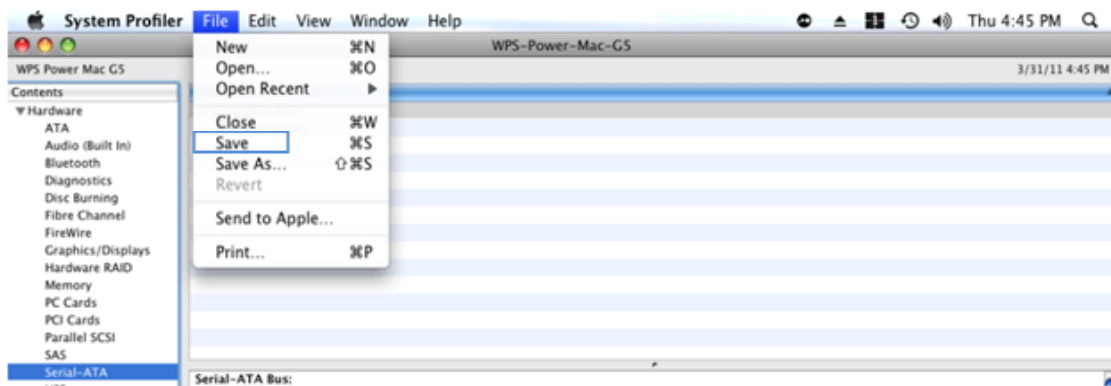
- If you save a report as plain text, you can open it in almost any editing program, from Notepad on up.
- If you save it as RTF, you can open it in almost any word processing program, including Microsoft Word.
- If you save it in System Profiler format, you can double-click it to open it in System Profiler.

To save a System Profiler report:

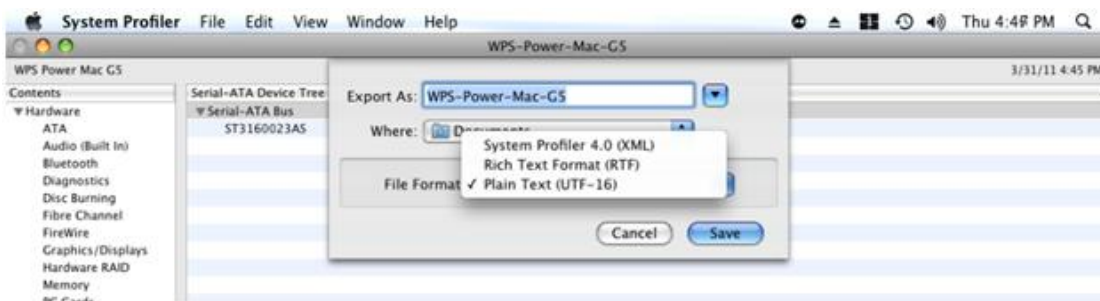
1. Make sure the report contains the information you want. To see more or less information, choose **View > Full Report** or **View > Mini Report**.



2. Choose **File > Save**.



3. Select a format from the **File Format** pop-up.



4. Type a name for the saved report.
5. Choose where you want to save the report. (The **Document** folder is the default location.)
6. Click **Save**.
